#### **BACKGROUND**

The Foundation periodically receives requests regarding funding and/or sponsorship of events and organizations.

#### **FINDINGS**

At the February 28 regular meeting, Foundation Member Malkin provided information on a proposed donation policy. He distributed copies of a Project Funding Program overview, a Funding Application and an envelope to help support the Foundation. It would be appropriate for the Foundation to discuss the proposed donation policy.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

It is recommended the Foundation discuss the proposed funding policy.



# Project Funding Program Fiscal Year 2017-2018

## **Program Overview**

The La Mirada Community Foundation's project funding program is designed to assist local non-profit organizations in funding projects that serve the public and promote the La Mirada Community Foundation and the City of La Mirada. The mission of the program is to provide support and funding to deserving special projects, which enhance the community in the following ways:

- Providing cultural and educational enrichment
- Celebrating our unique diversity, history and heritage
- Enhancing pride and a sense of community
- Promoting a positive image of the City of La Mirada
- Endorsing economic vitality

The program is designed to be a short-term assistance to help projects become established.

# **Eligibility Requirements**

- All applicants must be a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization
- Organization may only submit one application for a project.
- Multiple submissions will be not be considered
- Projects with multiple co-organizations will only be allowed to submit one application
- Ineligible organizations/projects
  - o City of La Mirada Departments
  - For-profit projects
  - For-profit/non-profit partnerships where the benefits to the non-profit organization cannot be demonstrated
  - School projects/events
  - o Any project were multiple organizations submit an application

## **Application Process**

All organizations must complete the following application process:

- Funding Application
- Provide a Certificate of 501(c)(3) Status
- Funding Project Budget Form
- Past or Current Promotional Materials

#### PLEASE NOTE:

- 1. Applications received that are incomplete will be considered ineligible.
- 2. Applications are reviewed to ensure they meet the application requirements. Applicants will be informed of missing items, if time permits.
- 3. There is NO guarantee that your application will be reviewed for acceptance by your project deadline, please do not wait until the last minute to submit the application.
- 4. Applications received after your project deadline will not be considered. You must complete the budget form and return it with your application.

## **Criteria and Review Process**

Applications for sponsorship are reviewed by the La Mirada Community Foundation and are based on the following criteria:

- Cultural and educational impact on the community and ability of the project to demonstrate La Mirada's unique diversity, history and heritage
- Ability of the project to promote community pride and a positive image of the City of La Mirada
- History of the applicant organization in producing the producing the project, managerial and administrative ability of the applicant's organization to carry out the project and properly administer sponsorship funds
- Economic impact on the community
- The number of years the organization has received funding and how established the project has become
- The support of the project by additional City of La Mirada funds, staff, or department
- Free vs. Admission based project if applicable

#### **Allocation of Funds**

No one applicant organization will receive more than \$5,000 in funding in any fiscal year (July 1 – June 30). Applicants are eligible for 50% of the project costs with the total allocation not to exceed \$5,000. It is possible that funding allocations may be lower than the amount requested by the applicant.

All applications receiving funds will be required to submit a final report on the project within 90 days following completion of their project. That report shall include documented use of awarded funds, project attendance and highlights, etc. Failure to submit the report, in its entirety, within the specified time line will eliminate the organization's ability to apply for funds during the next call for applications.

Final reports not submitted by the deadline will face penalties during the following year's application process. The following penalties will be assessed:

1 month late: 5%	
2 months late: 10%	of funds deducted from awarded amount for new
3 months late: 20%	approved funding application.
4 months late: 35%	approved randing approaches.
5 months late: 50%	
After 5 months considered	ineligible to submit an application for funds the
non-submittal of final report	next 5 years.

Incomplete final reports will be given one opportunity to make the corrections within 72 hours of notification. If corrections are completed within the 72 hour period, the final report will be considered accepted at turned in date. If submitted corrections exceed the 72 hour period, the final report will be considered received when the corrections have been completed.

## Ineligible Fees/Costs

Fees that are not eligible for funding are items not directly related to the project, or fees that would reimburse the administrative costs of the organization managing the project. Only cash expenses will be considered. Ineligible fees include, but are not limited to the following:

- Administrative/Payroll/Benefit Costs (salaries and/or wages for any full time/part time employee or contracted employee that works for the organization when project is not taking place)
- Consumable Goods (food, drinks, snacks)
- Any/All Costs Associated With the Sale of Alcohol (supplies, fencing, bartender, etc.)
- Membership/Professional Development/Conference Fees
- Non-Cash, In-Kind Services Or Fees That Are Waived and/or Sponsored by the City of La Mirada
- Postage (for advertisement, mailings, etc.)
- Other ineligible fees/cost include:
  - Liquor Licenses/Fees
  - Event Insurance Costs
  - Gifts/Take Home Promotions
  - Scholarships
  - Capital Expenses/Improvements
  - Application/Permit Fees

- Hospitality Items
- Storage Rental
- Credit Card Charges
- Music Licensing Fees
- Taxes

# **Appeals Procedure**

All decisions made by the La Mirada Community Foundation are final and are not subject to appeals or further review.

## **Quick Tips**

- It is important that you complete the entire application. The more detail that you provide the better as it will help the Foundation understand what your project's purpose is and how it will benefit the community. Incomplete applications will not be considered for the program.
- Only City of La Mirada based organizations will receive consideration for funding.
- Each question on the application is thoroughly reviewed but please pay particular attention to the following questions:
  - History of your organization and project
  - o How your project will have a cultural and educational impact on the community as well as how it will demonstrate La Mirada's unique diversity, history and heritage
  - o Ability to promote community pride and a positive image of the City of La Mirada or Economic impact
  - A detailed budget
- Although not required, it is very helpful if you provide financial reports from past two years to show the Foundation your organization's ability to manage a budget, carry out the project and properly administer Foundation funds.
- Please understand that you are not guaranteed to receive funding and in the event that you do receive funding, it may be less then what you requested on your application.
- Applicants are encouraged to attend the review meeting to clarify information on the application or budget. This may assist the Foundation in making a decision.
- Keep a copy of the submitted application and budget for your records.


