2. REVIEW OF FINANCIAL/INVESTMENT REPORTS

Foundation Secretary Haraksin discussed the Financial/Investment Reports for the month of August 2018.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

5. DISCUSSION REGARDING ITEMS FOR THE UPCOMING RETREAT

Foundation Members discussed items for the upcoming retreat which will be held on Saturday, October 27 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. at City Hall. Foundation Members submitted topics to discuss during the retreat. Foundation Secretary Haraksin said the topics to be discussed could include the Foundation's history, mission statement, purpose, policy and process, propose amended bylaws and marketing/promotional activities. Foundation Members agreed with the topics.

6. DISCUSSION REGARDING THE FIREWORKS COMMITTEE UPDATE

Foundation Member Malkin provided a fireworks update. He said a total of 13 retail permit applications from community organizations and La Mirada High School were received. He said the Fireworks Subcommittee reviewed the applications and determined that the requirements were applicable to the issuance of retail and wholesale fireworks stand permits. He said the wholesaler generated approximately \$235,000 in fireworks sales and approximately \$436,000 in retail sales, which the groups profited approximately \$201,000. He said preliminary reports indicated that the groups were able to achieve a goal of 48 percent net profit for each booth.

FOUNDATION MEMBER ANNOUNCEMENTS

Member Malkin distributed a copy of the Friends of The La Mirada Library newsletter. He invited Foundation Members to the Spring Book Sale on Saturday, October 6 from 9 a.m. to 3:30 at the La Mirada Activity Center. Member Malkin said he attended the performance of Janis Joplin at the La Mirada Theatre for the Performing Arts.

Member Zoellner said he attended the For Maddi's Closet fundraising event. He said the event went well.

STAFF ANNOUNCEMENTS

Foundation Secretary Haraksin reported on the Volunteer Appreciation Day at Splash! La Mirada Regional Aquatics Center. She said it would held on Sunday, October 7, 2018 from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. inside Splash!'s Buccaneer Bay.

**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING
LA MIRADA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION
LA MIRADA, CALIFORNIA
OCTOBER 27, 2018**

The meeting was called to order at 8 a.m. on October 27 in Community Room AB, La Mirada City Hall, 13700 La Mirada Boulevard, La Mirada, California.

Call to Order

President Lord called the meeting to order.

Roll Call

Foundation Members were present with Member Grotz, Member Hall, Member Harbaugh, Member Malkin, Member Zoellner, Member Yutani, Vice President Watkins, and President Lord responding to roll call. Foundation Member Dames was absent. Foundation Secretary Haraksin and Assistant City Clerk Revilla were also present.

La Mirada Community Foundation Workshop

(1) History of the La Mirada Community Foundation.

Foundation Member Malkin provided information on the Foundation's history. He distributed a Program and Financial History of the La Mirada Community Foundation from 2001 through 2017. He provided information on the Foundation's donation history.

The Community Foundation reviewed and discussed the Program and Financial History of the La Mirada Foundation.

(2) Proposed Amendments to the Bylaws.

Foundation Secretary Haraksin provided information on the Community Foundation bylaws.

The Community Foundation reviewed and discussed the bylaws and proposed the following amendments:

- Section 5.03 Term of Office of Directors
The Foundation recommended the term of office for the President be two years rather than four years.
- Section 5.06(c)(ii)(4) Annual Regular and Special Meetings
The Foundation recommended the reference to telegrams be deleted and a method using current versions of electronic communications be added as follows:

"4. By current versions of electronic communications."
- Section 5.07 Quorum
The Foundation recommended the definition of a quorum as referenced in the first sentence be modified as follows:

“A majority of current members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, except to adjourn as provided in Section 5.09.”

As currently written, a quorum is defined as a majority of the authorized number of Directors, which is 20 members.

- Section 6.01 Committees of the Board
The Foundation recommended the last sentence in the paragraph be clarified as follows:

“Any committee, to the extent provided in the resolution of the Board, shall have all of the authority of the Board, except that committee, regardless of the Board resolution, may not.”

Foundation Members expressed support for amending the Community Foundation bylaws.

(3) Purpose and Mission of the La Mirada Community Foundation.

Foundation Members reviewed and discussed the Foundation’s mission statement. Members expressed support for maintaining the existing mission statement. Foundation Members suggested the mission statement be included on documents such as the Foundation’s agenda, City’s website, bylaws, scholarship and fireworks applications.

(4) Policies and Process to Request Funding.

Foundation Members reviewed and discussed the policies and process to request funding. Member Malkin provided information on the different types of non-profit organizations. Additionally, he distributed a revised grant application.

Foundation Members reviewed the revised grant application and provided feedback. Foundation Members expressed concerns with the revised grant application and suggested a pre-qualification application before completing the revised grant application. Member Malkin said he would create a pre-qualification application to help simplify the process.

Foundation Members also discussed updating the Foundation’s brochure. President Lord asked staff to contact Adrienne Medrano to inquire about the cost for a new Foundation brochure. Foundation Secretary Haraksin said she would contact Ms. Medrano to inquire and provide an update at an upcoming meeting.

(5) Marketing, Promotional Activities, and Community Project.

Foundation Members reviewed and discussed marketing and promotional activities. President Lord said he would like the Foundation to assist with searching for grant opportunities to seek various donations. He provided an example such as the Southern California Edison STEM which provides funding for the scholarship program. Member Malkin said he would contact Yahoo, Google and Living Spaces for grant funding opportunities. Member Zoellner said he would contact the NFL Rams for possible

fundraising opportunities, Member Yutani said he would contact Wells Fargo and Bank of the West, and Member Harbaugh said he would contact Bank of America.

Foundation Members also discussed its participation with Amazon Smile. President Lord said if enrolled with Amazon Smile the Foundation would receive 0.5 percent from each eligible product sold. Additionally, Member Zoellner said he would like to create a welcome basket for new residents to include general information about the Community Foundation.

Public Comments

Martin Nava was in attendance. He expressed an interest in serving on the Community Foundation.

Adjournment

There being no further business to come before the Community Foundation, President Lord adjourned the meeting at 1 p.m.
