ACTIVITY COMMENTARY

The City Council is the legislative and policy-making body for the City of La Mirada. Five Councilmembers are elected at large for four-year, overlapping terms of office. The Council annually elects one of its members to serve as Mayor. The Mayor presides over all Council meetings and is the ceremonial head of the City for official functions.

As La Mirada's elected representatives, the City Council represents the values of the electorate, determines viable community needs, and establishes municipal services. The Council determines service levels and revenue obligations through the adoption of an annual budget, authorizes City contracts and expenditures, establishes City service and operating policies, and adopts such regulatory measures as may be necessary for the protection of the community.

Councilmembers represent the City on various intergovernmental organizations to achieve governmental cooperation, legislation, and programs that are consistent with the community's needs.

GOALS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013

The City Council's goals are to continue providing open, honest, and responsive City government that aims to achieve a better quality of life for all La Mirada citizens. The City Council develops policies and programs which are cost effective and productive and maintain La Mirada's fiscal integrity (balanced budget) while providing a high level of service to the community. The City Council will also continue to meet the needs of citizens and local businesses while keeping public safety a priority.

The City Clerk's office is responsible for preparing, compiling and distributing City Council agenda packets for City Council meetings; preparing the official minutes of the City Council; certifying official records including minutes, ordinances and resolutions; administering oaths; publishing and posting legal notices; maintaining the City's central filing system and the legislative history; ensuring the timely codification of the La Mirada Municipal Code; distributing plans and specifications and conducting bid openings for City projects; receiving liability claims against the City and requests for copies of public records; and administering the filing of the Statements of Economic Interests for public officials and designated employees pursuant to the provisions of the Political Reform Act of 1974 as regulated by the Fair Political Practices Commission. The City Clerk is also responsible for the operations of the front counter at City Hall, ensuring excellent customer service at all times to all our customers.

GOALS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013

The goal of the City Clerk's office is to assist the City in meeting the State law requirements related to the compilation and preservation of official records, conduct of public meetings and bids, notification of interested parties of Council determinations, and the preparation of City Council agendas and minutes. The City Clerk ensures compliance with State and local regulations pertaining to conflicts of interest. The City Clerk also remains current on new laws, works to streamline office procedures, maintains, protects and preserves official records.
